#### October: Down Syndrome Awareness Month

Did you know that October is Down Syndrome Awareness month? Here are some facts about Down syndrome to share with your family and friends!

- Down syndrome occurs when an individual has a full or partial extra copy of chromosome 21. This additional
  genetic material alters the course of development and causes the characteristics associated with Down syndrome.
- There are three types of Down syndrome: trisomy 21 (nondisjunction) accounts for 95% of cases, translocation accounts for about 4%, and mosaicism accounts for about 1%.
- Down syndrome is the most commonly occurring chromosomal condition.
- One in every 691 babies in the United States is born with Down syndrome about 6,000 each year. There are approximately 400,000 people living with Down syndrome in the United States. Down syndrome occurs in people of all races and economic levels.
- People with Down syndrome attend school, work, participate in decisions that affect them, have meaningful relationships, vote and contribute to society in many wonderful ways.




# <u>FREE</u> Newborn Book From DownSyndromePregnancy.org!



According to Michigan Alliance for families,

"The ABLE Act has been signed into law in Michigan!



The Michigan Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE Act) allows for savings accounts to be used for spending on education, housing, transportation, employment training and support, assistive technology and personal support services, health, prevention and wellness, financial management, legal fees and other expenses.

Money in an ABLE Act account is exempt from being counted against an individual when determining financial eligibility for assistance programs."
